

Home Energy Rebates Progress Tracker

Through the Home Energy Rebates, you may be eligible for cash back on appliances and other home improvements that can lower your energy bills. The map below shows your state's progress toward launching its rebates.

State Progress Toplines

- **52** states and territories have applied to DOE for early administrative or full program funding.
- 45 states and territories have applied to DOE for full funding to launch their programs.
- These states and territories have applied for \$7.1 billion in funding.

Note: Many states are rolling out their programs incrementally. Eligible technologies and participants may be limited in the initial phases of program implementation. This map's color codes reflect applications for full program funding. DOE also offers states the option to apply for early administrative funding to help set up their programs. States and territories bypassing this application will receive these funds as part of their full program funding. Click on your state to see if it has applied for or received early administrative funding.
