

Large-Scale Water Recycling Program

Section 40905 of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), P.L. 117-58 provides authority for Reclamation's Large-Scale Water Recycling Program. The program will provide \$450 million over the next five years to projects in Reclamation states that have a total project cost greater than or equal to \$500,000,000, at 25% Federal cost share, with no per-project maximum. Large-scale recycled water projects will play an important role in helping communities develop local, drought-resistant sources of water supply by turning currently unusable water sources into a new source of water supply that is less vulnerable to drought and climate change.

Projects will become eligible to compete for funding under the Large-Scale Water Recycling Program once Reclamation has reviewed a feasibility study submitted by the

non-Federal project sponsor and has informed Congress that the project meets Reclamation's requirements. Temporary guidelines for the preparation of feasibility studies are established by WTR TRMR-128, [Large-Scale Water Recycling Program Feasibility Study Review Process](#)

Biden-Harris Administration Launches New Large-Scale Water Recycling Program with \$180 Million from Bipartisan Infrastructure Law



The Department of the Interior today announced the launch of a new large-scale water recycling program and made \$180 million in initial funding from President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law available for projects aimed at creating new water supplies that are less vulnerable to drought and climate change. To date, the Bureau of Reclamation has invested \$310 million from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law for projects that advance water recycling and reuse. The new program will incentivize projects at a larger scale, with no cap on project size, and will play an important role in helping communities develop local, drought-resistant water supplies by turning unusable water sources into clean, reliable ones. 

The [FY23 and FY24 Large-Scale Water Recycling Projects funding opportunity](#) was posted September 7, 2023. Submission periods: first round of applications are due November 21, 2023; second round of applications are due March 20, 2024; final round of applications are due September 30, 2024.

The [FY23 and FY24 Title XVI Congressionally Authorized Projects](#) and [Title XVI WIIN Act Projects](#) funding opportunity was posted September 28. There are two submission periods. Submission deadlines are December 7, 2023 and February 28, 2024.
