

2022 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law Funded Fish Passage Projects

About this Collection

A collection of fish passage projects funded through the 2022 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law provided \$455 million to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to be distributed across five programs. The largest amount, \$200 million over five years, was provided to the <u>National Fish Passage Program</u>, the only national scale program to receive Service Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding. This funding more than tripled the annual amount of funding available for fish passage projects under the program. The huge increase in funding allowed the program to target projects that were previously unattainable, like the <u>Numana Dam project</u> in Nevada – an \$8.3 million project that will reconnect historic spawning habitat for native Lahontan Cutthroat trout and cui-ui on the lower Truckee River.
