Up to \$20 million in funding is available for fish passage and tribal capacity building under the <u>Bipartisan Infrastructure Law</u>. This funding will support U.S. federally recognized tribes, Alaska Native Corporations, and tribal organizations in implementing fish passage work and building tribal organizational capacity.

In collaboration with NOAA, selected partners will use these funds to build tribal organizational capacity and implement projects that reopen migratory pathways and restore access to healthy habitat for tribally-important species. Selected projects may also provide community and economic benefits, such as enhancing climate resilience by removing or improving aging infrastructure.

NOAA will accept proposals between \$300,000 and \$6 million for the entire award, with typical funding anticipated to range from \$500,000 to \$4 million.

# Who Can Apply?

Eligible applicants are Indian tribes (as defined in 25 U.S.C. Section 5304 (e)) and organizations that represent Indian tribes through formal legal agreements.

# **How to Apply**

Applicants should apply through the <a href="www.Grants.gov">www.Grants.gov</a> website. A complete standard NOAA financial assistance application package should be submitted in accordance with the guidelines in the Notice of Funding Opportunity announcement posted to <a href="www.Grants.gov">www.Grants.gov</a>. Each application must include the application forms from the SF-424 form family.

# **New Grant Application Process: eRA Commons**

The Department of Commerce has transitioned their grants management system from Grants Online to eRA Commons. <u>Learn the new process for submitting a grant application to NOAA Fisheries</u>, including common errors that are important to review to ensure NOAA receives your application.
