Up to \$75 million in funding is available for fish passage projects under the <u>Bipartisan Infrastructure</u> <u>Law</u>. This funding will support projects that reopen migratory pathways and restore access to healthy habitat for fish around the country.

In collaboration with NOAA, selected partners will use these funds to implement locally-led removals of dams and other in-stream barriers. Selected projects will assist in sustaining our nation's fisheries and contributing to the recovery of threatened and endangered species. They may also provide community and economic benefits, such as jobs and climate resilience.

NOAA will accept proposals between \$750,000 and \$8 million for the entire award, with typical funding anticipated to range from \$3 million to \$5 million.

Application Process

Who Can Apply?

Eligible applicants are institutions of higher education, non-profits, commercial (for profit) organizations, U.S. territories, and state, local, and tribal governments.

How to Apply

Applicants should apply through the www.Grants.gov website. A complete standard NOAA financial assistance application package should be submitted in accordance with the guidelines in the Notice of Funding Opportunity announcement posted to www.Grants.gov. Each application must include the application forms from the SF-424 form family.

New Grant Application Process: eRA Commons

The Department of Commerce has transitioned their grants management system from Grants Online to eRA Commons. <u>Learn the new process for submitting a grant application to NOAA Fisheries</u>, including common errors that are important to review to ensure NOAA receives your application.
