partisan Infrastructure Law summary: "Shall be for restoring fish passage by moving in-stream barriers and providing technical assistance pursuant to section 1.7 of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Reauthorization 2006 (16 U.S.C. 1891a), of which up to 15 percent shall be reserved for Indian ibes or partnerships of Indian Tribes."

DAA's Office of Habitat Conservation's Restoration Center will implement the fish issage provision by providing technical assistance and funding through competitive ant processes over five years to restore fish passage through the removal of dams id other in-stream barriers to restore marine, estuarine, coastal, and Great Lakes osystem habitat. There will be two grant competitions held in 2022, one specifically cused on tribes.

nis funding will support projects that reopen migratory pathways and restore access healthy habitat for fish around the country. Not only will these projects assist in the covery of endangered migratory fish and our nation's fisheries, they also provide mmunity and economic benefits, such as jobs and climate resilience.

ne goal is to fund projects that eliminate in-stream barriers to restore fish passage hile applying a watershed approach that addresses fish passage barriers throughout waterway/ecosystem, and increases resilience to climate change by removing or proving outdated infrastructure.

dditionally, up to 15 percent of funds will be directed to Indian Tribes through a cused grant competition to address tribal priority restoration
